IAN D'AGATA wine – 97 pts- Rich and multilayered, this is an extremely complex Barbaresco that is brimming with aromas and flavours of red fruit, cinnamon and camphor. Finishes very long with smooth tannins and harmonious acidity that nicely frames the glossy red fruit and extends its presence on the long back end. Drinking window: 2028-2042.

ANTONIO GALLONI – VINOUS 95 pts The wine is complex, dynamic and youthfully austere, it's really classic. Dark toned fruit, menthol, licorice, sòpice, gravel, incense, tobacco and dried herbs fill our the layers. Medium in body and complex withg myriad shades of expression, he is a drop-dead gorgeous beauty.

JAMES SUCKLING – 94 pts. A charming, fruits-and-flowers aroma and the rather broad and velvety palate make this one enjoyable already. Rose petals, orange zest, red cherries and a hint of tart cherry provide plenty of pleasure, while relatively soft tannins keep it smooth. Best through to 2030

Jancis Robinson- by Walter Speller. 17,5 PTS Barbaresco. Lustrous and just mid ruby. Bags of minerals on the nose while the fruit is still a little subdued but clearly concentrated. Juicy, elegant red fruit with deep gravelly tannins that demand more time. Long and a little mouth-watering on the finish. (WS)
